



Ph.D. Admission Announcement for the Session 2021-22

Medical Faculties: Anatomy, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Pathology, Community Medicine, Forensic Medicine, Clinical Psychology and All Clinical Subjects (including Super-Specialty).

Other Faculties: Pharmacy, Physiotherapy & Dentistry (Prosthodontics, Conservative, Orthodontics and Oral Surgery).

1. ELIGIBILITY:

FULL TIME /PART TIME CANDIDATES

Every candidate who presents himself/herself for registration for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) must possess Post Graduate/Super-Specialty Degree with minimum 55% (50% for ST/SC/OBC/PWD) awarded by this University or of any other University or any other qualification recognized by this University as equivalent thereto; as prescribed by university time to time.

Note: Candidates appearing in the final semester/year examination of Masters(PG)/ Super-Specialty degree are also eligible to apply and appear in the Entrance examination. However, their enrolment in Ph.D. Course will be subject to the fulfillment of all the essential requirements. The results of Pre Ph.D. Entrance Examination of such candidate will be announced only after verification of marks at the PG level examinations.

2. DURATION OF RESEARCH WORK

- The candidates registered for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) as full time research scholars shall undergo research work for a minimum period of THREE years.
- The candidates registered for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) as part time research scholars shall undergo research work for a minimum period of FIVE years from the date of provisional registration.
- The period of training for Ph.D. shall be TWO years for full time candidates and FOUR years for part time candidates who possess M.D./M.S/PG/DM/M.Ch.(super-specialty branch).
- In-service candidates can pursue Ph.D. in Part Time mode only after procuring NOC from present employer stating that they have no-objection if the candidate fulfill the residential requirement during course work i.e. 6 months and contact days with supervisor of 100 days from 2nd year onwards or as notified by University from time to time.
- The maximum period of research shall not exceed SIX years for both the candidates.
- Extension beyond the above limits will be governed by the relevant clauses as stipulated in the Statues/Ordinance of the University.
- The women candidates and Differently-abled categories (more than 40% disability) may be allowed a relaxation of two years for Ph.D. in the maximum duration. In addition the women candidate may be provided Maternity Leave/Child Care Leave once in the entire duration of Ph.D. for upto 240 days.
- Full time candidate shall attend the department for research on all working days, except for periods when he/she is allowed to visit other institutions/laboratories for activities connected with research for a period permitted by the concerned Guide.



- A candidate shall be required to complete his/her research under the direct supervision of his/her Guide or Research Supervisor. However, a candidate who is a full time teacher or the person in service, shall be permitted to complete the research work at his/her college or place of his/her duty or appointment. In such condition, it shall be mandatory for such teacher/ candidate or person in Government / Private Service to work at least 180 days in the full tenure of the Ph. D. course, by way of leave / Vacation / deputation, etc. under direct supervision of his guide or research Supervisor before submission of the final thesis. The certificate from the Guide or Research Supervisor regarding mandatory attendance of the Ph.D. scholar, along with signature of Head of Institution shall be pre-condition for submission of final thesis through the Institution.

3. PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO Ph.D. PROVISIONAL REGISTRATION

3.1 There shall be a two-phased admission process for the Ph.D. programme of the Geetanjali University. **Phase – I:** Entrance examination (weightage : 70%) and **Phase – II:** Research Proposal Presentation & Personal Interview (weightage : 30%). There shall be an All-India based Entrance Examination , twice a year viz., January and July or as decided by the University of each Calendar year, for admission for the Ph.D. Programme after due advertisement.

- Only those candidates who secure minimum 50% [(45% for the candidates belongs to SC/ST/OBC(Non-Creamy Layer)/Differently-abled categories] or as decided by the University in Entrance Examination would be eligible for applying for admission.
- Notwithstanding the above, candidates who have passed the CSIR-UGC – ICMR JRF / NET examination (or) examination by agencies like DBT/DST etc. (or) GATE (or) shall be exempted from appearing for the Ph.D. Entrance Examination provided the above-said examinations have been qualified in the same year or in one year of span of the conductance of Ph.D. Entrance Examination by the Geetanjali University.

3.2 A candidate applying for provisional registration shall submit an application in the prescribed form obtainable from the University Office alongwith the required documents and fee, within the stipulated time furnishing the following information:-

- Qualifications and details of previous study and research if any, and full particulars of publications (with reprints) to his/her credit in accredited journals;
- Broad field of research in which he/she intends to pursue research;
- After successfully clearing the **Phase – I:** Ph.D. Entrance Examination, candidates are invited for **Phase – II:** Research Proposal Presentation and Personal Interview, which includes introduction; review of literature and research gap; aims and objective of the study; plan of work; materials and methods; hypothesis and anticipated outcome references; questionnaire if any



3.3 Candidate who intends to carry out research in any other institution shall forward the application to the Registrar of this University with the recommendation of the Guide from this University, Head of the Department and Head of the other Institution concerned.

3.4 Applications of the candidates will be placed before the University Research Committee. The Committee will examine the credentials of the candidate & the guide and review the usefulness of the research proposal after due presentation followed by personal interview. Candidates who have satisfactorily defended their proposed research alone will be recommended by the Research Committee for provisional registration. If the Research Committee does not *prima facie* find the applicant qualified and/or the research proposal suitable, it may recommend rejection of the application for provisional registration straightaway. The Committee may also direct the candidate to submit a revised proposal incorporating the recommendations made by it.

3.5 Only a pre-determined number of students shall be admitted to the Ph. D. programme.

Note: Admission in Ph.D. degree program is based on Merit, availability of Ph.D. Guide in respective subject and research support. Passing of Entrance Examination does not necessarily guarantee of enrolment in Ph.D. program.

Phase – I: The examination (Phase – I) will consist of Two Papers, Paper I and Paper II

Paper I – Research Aptitude

Multiple Choice Questions 50 :

Total Marks : 150

Negative Marks : 1

Paper-1 will be common to all candidates and will include questions on teaching aptitude, research aptitude, reading comprehension, communication, reasoning (including mathematical), logical reasoning, data interpretation, information and computer literacy.
